Crank up the AF Gain By Kevan Nason, N4XL

As many of us age the youngsters more frequently call us deaf. It isn't limited to young'uns. My wife is 15 years older than I and she thinks I'm deaf too. She admits she's confused though. She sometimes asks 'I know you can hear okay because you hear quiet things like cars approaching long before I do. So why are you asking me what I said?'

Bruce M0PUS wrote on the RSGBTechnical Groups.io reflector. "There is a big difference between being deaf and having difficulty decoding speech. However, the symptoms are so similar that most people will insist that you are deaf because they haven't experienced decoding difficulties and so don't understand that your mishearing could possibly be due to any thing other than deafness. The accepted "cure" for deafness is to turn up the volume, but this rarely improves decoding errors. Being unable to hear correctly in the presence of noise is certainly a symptom of deafness but noise has an even greater adverse effect on decoding difficulty. I should know because I've had decoding difficulty all my life even though I've had good hearing. Everyone says I'm deaf despite my being able to hear fainter sounds than they can, and despite hearing tests showing that even at 82, I have "the hearing of a man of 53". When on the air, turning up the volume does not improve matters, particularly in the presence of noise. I use a BHI noise reducer all the time, which DOES make a significant improvement. However, because this also makes an improvement (though lesser) for the deaf, I STILL get labelled as "deaf." You just can't win."

I've been aware for years that improving the S/N ratio of received audio has improved my ability to copy information in contests. Turning up the volume with S5+ band noise to copy a weak signal doesn't work for me. Turning down RF gain makes the wanted signal quieter, but it also reduces the noise making it just a little bit easier for me to separate message from noise. John W4IX taught me that trick.

I've taken over the headphones from dozens of operators while at Field Day sites, other stations, or even from people I've had contesting in my own shack. Very few of them turn down RF gain. Some use attenuation, but most instead turn up the AF gain and blast white noise and QRM into their ears at the same time as their desired signal. I prefer using RF gain over using the Attenuator because it gives me finer control than a fixed amount of attenuation. I used to preach not to use Noise Reduction in contests because it inherently introduces distortion to the signal. But I've since found it often helps me decode better too by reducing the noise more than it distorts the signal.

Another reason to avoid cranking the volume up is that not blasting S5+ noise into your ears hour after hour is less fatiguing and you get more enjoyment from your BIC time.



Ask the Elmers (an advice column for Hams)

Dear Elmers,

I heard there is a solar eclipse happening sometime this year (2024). When will it happen, and will we be able to see it in South Carolina? Also, does a solar eclipse cause problems with ham radio transmissions?

-- Just wondering

Dear Just Wondering,

Thank you for your question.

Seeing a solar eclipse, especially a total solar eclipse, is a truly awesome experience, and a rare occurrence in most people's lives. Hopefully, you experienced the total solar eclipse that occurred over South Carolina on August 21, 2017.

If you didn't, then you're out of luck as unfortunately, South Carolina is nowhere near the path of totality for the April 8, 2024, solar eclipse. However, depending on the local weather, you may be able to catch the partial eclipse which will be visible throughout all 48 contiguous U.S. states.

As to whether a solar eclipse affects ham radio signals, the answer is yes, When the moon blocks the sun during a solar eclipse, there is a noticeable change in the Ionosphere, or upper atmosphere of the Earth. This change in the Ionosphere affects radio communications, including ham radio.
